Center project in Burrillville, Rhode Island ("Clear River" or "CREC" or "Facility").

A. I have a Bachelor of Science in Resource Development from University of Rhode Island,
Bachelor of Fine Arts and a Bachelor of Landscape Architecture from The Rhode Island School
of Design. I am a Registered Landscape Architect in Rhode Island, Massachusetts and

A. I have been qualified as an expert and have testified over a period of thirty (30) years
before Planning Commissions and Zoning Boards in Rhode Island and Massachusetts, as well as
the Rhode Island Coastal Resources Management Council. I have been qualified as a Registered
Landscape Architect, Licensed Arborist, Horticulturalist and Certified Professional in Soil
Erosion and Sediment Control.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY?

7 A. The purpose of my testimony is to provide information and answer questions regarding
8 CREC's landscape architecture drawing, attached to my testimony as Exhibit JC-1.

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Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE ALL RELEVANT STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS PERTINENT TO CREATING LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE DRAWINGS.

12 A. The standards for preparing Landscape Architecture Drawings in Rhode Island are 13 governed by the RI General Laws § 5-51-1 and the Board of Examiners of Landscape Architects 14 Rules and Regulations. In addition, the drawing was prepared to comply with the Town of 15 Burrillville Subdivision and Development Plan Review Checklist and the Burrillville 16 Development Plan Review Regulations.

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Q. DID YOU PREPARE THE DRAWINGS ACCORDING TO THE SPECIFICATIONS IN THOSE REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS?

A. In my opinion, the drawing which I prepared was done in accordance with the above referred to State law and rules and regulations as well as the Town plan review checklist and regulations.

23 Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE YOUR APPROACH TO THE DESIGN OF THE

ENTRANCE? A. The proposed entrance from Wallum Lake Road to the proposed Facility was designed to

26 respect the rural streetscape which presently exists. The entrance road will be framed by two

stone columns constructed out of indigenous stone and will be set back approximately 30' from

the edge of the road to allow for unrestricted turning radius and sight lines. The land abutting
 Wallum Lake Road, extending approximately 150' x 150', will be cleared of the understory
 brush and planted with grass to create a "park like" aesthetic.

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
Q. DID YOU CONSIDER THE FACT THAT CREC'S ENTRANCE IS ON A STATE HIGHWAY WHEN DESIGNING THESE DRAWINGS?

A. Yes I did. That is why the proposed entrance columns will be set back approximately 30'
from the edge of pavement, and approximately 18' from the Right of Way line along the state
highway.
