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Invenergy's rationale for siting the power plant in Burrillville is the confluence of a gas line and power transmission line at the same geographic location. Not exactly. In order to export the power developed at that plant, an additional 8 mile high tension service line has to be constructed to the Sherman Farm Road switching station. The gas transmission line is not the only source of fuel for this plant. Gas line flow becomes insufficient in cold temperatures and the 2 million gallons of fuel oil will be used. That oil is not delivered to the site by a pipeline, it will be delivered by trucks. Trucks can deliver to any site not just this one. The Burrillville site and only the Burrillville site is a fallacy. There is an old power plant site in Providence that has high tension lines. There are oil and gas docking facilities nearby. There is plenty of cooling water in the upper bay. It's the perfect spot! No it's not because Gina will see it from her office window. This is not; not in my backyard. This is not in anybody's backyard.

There is another 1 Gigawatt proposed power plant just like this one that will be built in Uxbridge. It will be built in a reclaimed gravel pit next to the Blackstone River. We are the battleground for competing power plants and we are cannon fodder in this battle for corporate greed. Will these things be popping up all over the place like Walmarts?

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
