### MOTION TO INTERVENE OF COX RHODE ISLAND TELCOM, L.L.C.

Now comes Cox Rhode Island Telcom, L.L.C. ("Cox") and respectfully requests the right to intervene as a party in the above-referenced proceeding pursuant to Section 1.13(a) of the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.
