**REPORT AND ORDER**

On March 28, 2007, Narragansett Electric d/b/a National Grid (“NGrid” or “the Company”) submitted pursuant to Rule 1.9 of the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission’s (“Commission”) Rules and Regulations, a tariff advice filing to Amend its GreenUp Service Terms and Conditions R.I.P.U.C. No. 1167-B.<sup>1</sup> The filing requested an effective date of November 12, 2007.

NGrid requested three tariff changes. Both of these proposed changes are designed to bring the GreenUp Program in line with the Competitive Supply switching rules by prohibiting off cycle switching for initiation or termination of GreenUp Service and requiring that switching be concurrent with the customer’s billing cycle. The first change requested was to Section 4B that currently describes the Effective Date as “at least two business days after the enrollment transaction was received by the Distribution Company and successful.” The Company requested that this language be modified to change the date of initiation of GreenUp Service to the “next scheduled meter read, provided that the GreenUp Supplier has submitted the enrollment transaction to the Distribution Company no fewer than two business days prior to the meter read date.”<sup>2</sup>

The second change requested by NGrid is a change in the date of termination of GreenUp Service to the date of the customer’s next scheduled meter read, provided that the termination transaction to the Distribution Company has been submitted by the

GreenUp Supplier no fewer than two business days prior to the meter read date. Currently the language requires the service drop date to be at least two business days after the “supplier drops customer” transaction is received by the Distribution Company.<sup>3</sup>

The third change proposed by NGrid was to amend Exhibit B, the Service Agreement, to reflect the current electronic transmission vehicle (“EVT”) being employed by NGrid as the North American Energy Standards Board (“NAESB”) version 1.6 that has resulted in the elimination of charges to GreenUp Suppliers which occurred with the previous transmission vehicle, the value added network (“VAN”).<sup>4</sup>

On April 13, 2007, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers (“Division”) filed a memorandum with the Commission outlining the three proposed changes to the Tariff and recommending approval of those proposed changes.<sup>5</sup>

At an Open Meeting on May 10, 2007, the Commission unanimously approved NGrid’s changes to the GreenUp Service Terms and Conditions.

Accordingly, it is hereby

(18956 ) ORDERED:

1. National Grid’s tariff advice filing to amend GreenUp Service Terms and Conditions is hereby approved, effective November 12, 2007.
