ORDER REVISING NEW AND EXISTING GENERATION PERCENTAGES

WHEREAS, On February 5, 2008, Woronoco Hydro, LLC (Company), filed with the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission (PUC) an application seeking certification for the Woronoco Hydro Generation Unit, a 2.70 MW small hydro energy generation unit located in Russell, Massachusetts, as capable of producing as both an eligible New and Existing Renewable Energy Resource in accordance with the PUC's Rules and Regulations Governing the Implementation of a Renewable Energy Standard (RES Rules) and R.I. Gen Laws § 39-26-1¹; and

WHEREAS, Effective November 19, 2008, the PUC approved the Woronoco Hydro Generation Unit as meeting the requirements for eligibility as both a New and Existing, Small Hydro Renewable Energy Resource with 62.6% designated eligible as an Existing Generating Unit² and 37.4% designated eligible as a New Generating Unit³; and

WHEREAS, On January 28, 2013, pursuant to Section 6.3 of the RES Rules, the PUC issued a request to the Company for assistance in verifying the calculation of percent New and Existing allocations, and revising them if necessary; and

WHEREAS, On March 18, 2014, following discussions with the PUC's application review consultant, and review of proposed revisions to the previously

approved New and Existing allocation percentages for the Woronoco Hydro Generation Unit, the Company requested PUC approval of a revised certification of the Woronoco Hydro Generation Unit as a 28% Rhode Island New Renewable Energy Resource and 72% Rhode Island Existing Renewable Energy Resource, a change from 37.4% and 62.6% respectively; and

WHEREAS, On March 18, 2014, the PUC's consultant submitted a Memorandum to the PUC explaining the review process and providing documentation to support the recommended changes to the allocations; and

WHEREAS, After examination, the PUC is of the opinion that the revised percentage New and Existing allocations are accurate, reasonable and in compliance with the RES Regulations, and hereby grants these changes to become effective for the NEPOOL GIS 2014 Compliance Year; and

WHEREAS, The PUC's determination in this docket is based on the information submitted by the Company and the PUC may reverse its ruling or revoke the Company's certification if any material information provided by the Company proves to be false or misleading.

Accordingly, it is

(21409) ORDERED:

1) Effective for the NEPOOL GIS 2014 Compliance Year, the percentage New allocation of monthly generation from the Woronoco Hydro Generation Unit shall be changed from 37.4% to 28%.


2) Effective for the NEPOOL GIS 2014 Compliance Year, the percentage Existing allocation of monthly generation from the Woronoco Hydro Generation Unit shall be changed from 62.6% to 72%.

3) Although the PUC will rely upon the NEPOOL GIS for verification of production of energy from the Company's Generation Unit certified as eligible in this Order, the Company will provide information and access as necessary to the PUC, or persons acting at its behest, to conduct audits or site visits to assist in verification of continued eligibility for and compliance with Rhode Island RES Certification at any time at the PUCs' discretion.

4) The Company shall notify the PUC in the event of a change in the facility's eligibility status.


