REPORT AND ORDER

On February 28, 2008, The Narragansett Bay Commission (“NBC”) submitted pursuant to Rule 1.9(c) of the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission’s (“Commission”) Rules and Regulations, a tariff advice filing to amend its current tariffs in order to accommodate the requirements of R.I.G.L. §42-12.11-4.¹ The filing requested an effective date of April 1, 2008.

R.I.G.L. §42-12.11-4 requires a disposal facility operator to assess a fee of one dollar (\$1.00) per every hundred gallons of septage disposed at a disposal facility in the state and to remit such payment four times per year to the State of Rhode Island. NBC amended its tariff to reflect this statutory requirement. On March 6, 2008, NBC filed a revision to its tariff advice correcting a reference to the statute.²

On March 11, 2008, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers (“Division”) filed a memorandum with the Commission outlining the proposed changes to the Tariff and recommending approval of those proposed changes.³

At an Open Meeting on March 27, 2008, the Commission discussed the proposed changes and noted that the tariff should include the actual dollar amount charged. With the inclusion of the dollar amount, the Commission unanimously approved NBC’s change to its tariff.



(19262) ORDERED:


