| <p>A.</p> <p>1.</p> <p>2.</p> <p>3.</p> <p>4.</p> <p>5.</p> | <p>An ILP PIC NRC applies per change for each telephone exchange service line or trunk.</p> <p>For 90 days immediately following the date of implementation, customers may make one ILP PIC change without charge.</p> <p>The ILP PIC charge does not apply for new service customers selecting an ILP PIC at the time they place an order with the Telephone Company for telephone exchange service.</p> <p>A new customer who did not select an ILP PIC at the time service was being established and as a result was provided access code dialing as an alternative, has 60 days to request a change from access code dialing to the Telephone Company or to another carrier, and no ILP PIC charge will apply. Customers requesting a change after 60 days will incur the ILP PIC charge.</p> <p>The ILP PIC charge applies for an intraLATA PIC change on a line. The ILP PIC charge will be waived if an interLATA PIC change is also being requested on that line at the same time, and on the same service order, as the intraLATA PIC change request.</p> <p>Telephone Company end user Business customers who select Verizon Telephone Company as their intra-LATA toll carrier will receive a waiver for the applicable ILP PIC NRC associated with the business end user's selection of Verizon Telephone Company for intra-LATA toll service.</p> <p>The applicable ILP PIC NRC will be charged back when customers cancel their intra-LATA service or change their intra-LATA carrier from Verizon Telephone Company to another carrier within 12 months after selecting Verizon Telephone Company as their intra-LATA toll carrier.</p> |
| <p>B.</p> <p>1.</p> | <p>Service Charges— The applicable PUC RI No. 15 nonrecurring service order charge applies to reestablish a customer's OCP service.</p> <p>The charge does not apply when the customer's request is received within 90 days of the date upon which the customer's ILP PIC is changed from the Telephone Company.</p> |
| <p>C.</p> <p>1.</p> <p>2.</p> <p>a.</p> <p>b.</p> <p>3.</p> | <p>Unauthorized ILP PIC Change/Restoral</p> <p>If a customer denies authorizing a change in ILP as submitted by an IC, the customer will be credited the previously billed ILP PIC NRC, and the ILP PIC NRC will be waived for restoring the customer to its previous ILP PIC.</p> <p>The ILP PIC NRC will be assessed, as applicable, to an IC as set forth following when a customer denies authorizing the change in ILP as submitted by the IC (refer to Section 14.3.1A4).</p> <p>One ILP PIC NRC is assessed to the alleged unauthorized IC to recover the disputed ILP PIC NRC previously billed to the customer.</p> <p>One ILP PIC NRC is assessed to the alleged unauthorized IC to restore the customer to its previous ILP PIC.</p> <p>In accordance with the FCCs slamming liability rules in CC Docket 94-129, if an alleged unauthorized IC is ultimately exonerated of liability, the IC is entitled to receive full payment from the customer for all services provided. In such situations, any ILP PIC NRC assessed against the IC by the Telephone Company is subject to rebilling to the customer by the alleged unauthorized IC.</p> |

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
