## NOTICE OF TECHNICAL RECORD SESSION

Pursuant to the provisions of the Rhode Island General Laws §§39-1, 39-3 and 39-26-6(d), as amended, the Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") will conduct a Technical Record Session on **Tuesday**, **July 28**, **2009** @ **9:30 A.M.** in Hearing Room A of the Public Utilities Commission, located at 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island. The technical session may continue thereafter as required.

The Commission initiated this docket pursuant Rhode Island General Laws §39-26-6(d). The law requires that the Commission determine on or before January 1, 2010, the adequacy or potential adequacy of renewable energy supplies to meet the increase in percentage requirement of energy from renewable energy supplies to go into effect in 2011. To assist the Commission in making such determination, at this Technical Session, ISO New England will present its analysis of renewable portfolio standards (RPS) and related renewable goals in New England developed for the forthcoming 2009 Regional System Plan (RSP09), including proposed renewable generation projects in the ISO's Generator Interconnection Study Queue.

The Commission will continue with examination of testimony filed by Obligated Entities and Non-Obligated Entity intervernors on September 16, 2009.
