Record Request

Request:

With respect to section 2.2.3.2 of the RFP, please indicate the following:

- (a) Should a reasonable project schedule continue to rely on fixed dates as are currently contained in the RFP, or should it instead be calculated as a period of time after signing a contract?
- (b) Should the determination of a reasonable project schedule be technology dependent?

Response:

- (a) To provide for ease of use from year to year, the Company recommends that the project schedule should be adjusted to be calculated as a period of time after signing. In evaluating whether a project has a reasonable schedule, the RFP schedule will be used to project the time of contract execution from the issuance of the RFP. Specifically, project schedules should provide for
 - i. closing of construction financing and commencement of construction within 2 years, and
 - ii. for commercial operation within 5 years
- (b) That determination should be technology based. An exception to the above is reasonable for solar projects only. Solar projects should have schedules that provide for commercial operation within 24 months.
