Request:

The response to DIV 1-7 identifies a small customer deferral balance of (\$13,897,172). Is this the amount of over/under collection that was used in the calculation of the residential SOAF in the company's most recent retail rate filing (Dkt 4226)?

Response:

No. The Company is currently refunding an over collection of Standard Offer Service expense associated with small customer Standard Offer of \$1,436,690 as indicated on Schedule JAL-2, page 9 of 13 in Docket No. 4226.

The (\$13,897,172) balance in DIV 1-7 is not intended to represent the balance of the small customer Standard Offer reconciliation. The purpose of DIV 1-7 is intended to provide a comparison, for each individual month, of Standard Offer revenue and Standard Offer expense and not to represent the balance in the reconciliation.

If the answer to question 1 above is 'no':

- a. Please identify the amount of the residential small customer deferral balance that was used to calculate the residential SOAF in the company's most recent retail rate filing (Dkt 4226).
- b. Please identify the residential SOAF.
- c. Please provide the impact of the SOAF on a 500 kWk per month residential customer.

Response:

- a. The Company is currently refunding an over collection of small customer Standard Offer Service expense of \$1,436,690 as indicated on Schedule JAL-2, page 9 of 13 in Docket No. 4226.
- b. The Residential SOAF effective April 1, 2011 is a credit factor of 0.041¢ per kWh.
- c. The SOAF credit factor of 0.041¢ per kWh is a credit of \$0.21 per month for a residential Standard Offer Service customer using 500 kWh per month.
