Dear Ms. Wilson-Frias:

Cox Rhode Island Telcom, L.L.C. has recently received requests from four customers, including GTECH - requiring 200 numbers and Butler Hospital - requiring 400 numbers (two of our largest customers) for sequential numbers that Cox would like to provide from the 1,000 block of numbers that the Commission authorized in its June 30, 2011 Order in Docket No. 4256.

At the time of Cox's Petition in Docket 4256, Cox only required 100 numbers which is the basis for the Commission's Order requiring Cox to return the remaining 900 in the block. However, Cox now has a need to utilize 800 additional numbers from the block that was assigned by NeuStar (401.680.4).. For this reason, we would prefer not to return the 900 numbers as originally set forth in our Petition in Docket No. 4256. I recognize that this action will not be consistent with the Order.

Please let me know if Cox will need to file a formal waiver from this aspect of the Commission's Order or whether a new Petition is required in order for Cox to utilize these additional numbering resources from this block to meet these four new customer requirements. I can provide further information and details on a call if you prefer.
