### PUC Docket No. 4290 - Proposed Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program Enhancement Plan Rates

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#### Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)<sup>1</sup> Enhancement Charge – 2015

In accordance with RIGL § 39-1-27.12<sup>2</sup>, the Rhode Island Department of Human Services (DHS) files the following rate as the LIHEAP Enhancement Charge Rate for 2015:

The LIHEAP Enhancement Charge shall be seventy-three cents per month for each customer for the calendar year 2015, with the term “customer” defined as any person<sup>3</sup> taking service from an electric or a gas distribution company<sup>4</sup> at a single point of electricity or gas delivery or electric or gas meters, with a maximum total annual LIHEAP Enhancement Charge to any customer<sup>5</sup> capped at ten dollars (\$10.00).

The LIHEAP Enhancement Fund has a balance of approximately \$5,100,000 through September 2014. The Rhode Island Department of Human Services recommends that the funds collected from the rate be deposited into the same single fund/account as last year for consistency. The electric and gas company will provide a credit in an amount specified by the Rhode Island Department of Human Services to customer accounts that are receiving LIHEAP assistance payments.

The Rhode Island Department of Human Services has filed its State LIHEAP Plan with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to define eligibility for a household to participate in LIHEAP at sixty percent (60%) of the State Median Income (SMI) in the State of Rhode Island consistent with RIGL § 39-2-1.1(d).

The Rhode Island Department of Human Services and the Community Action Program agencies will continue to make designation of the qualifying customer accounts receiving LIHEAP payments through the 2015 LIHEAP eligibility criteria. Accounts receiving a 2015 benefit, both Primary and/or Crisis grants, will receive an additional credit from the LIHEAP Enhancement Fund. After consultation with the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers, the electric and gas distribution company, Community Action Program agencies, and other advocacy organizations

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presenting the interests of LIHEAP-eligible households, DHS will establish the amount of credits<sup>6</sup> to be applied to customers' accounts that are receiving LIHEAP payments.
