For the employees, the District maintains and provides an "Employee Handbook" which is a document describing the District's policies, procedures, benefits, etc. This handbook includes the availability of Healthcare, Dental and other insurance benefit coverage for the employees as part of the benefit package. For the Board members and legal counsel there is no written policy, however it has been past practice of the District to provide healthcare as one of the forms of compensation as the Board members and legal counsel carry out their duties. Board members and legal counsel pay the same co-pays and direct contributions as employees.

DIV 3-3. Please explain why the Health Care-Others amount identified in response to DIV 1-28 does not match the amount shown on Schedule DGB-3, page 1 of 3 for the Adjusted Rate Year.

RESPONSE:

In preparing the response to DIV 1-28, a rate of 10% was used to increase the rates from the interim year FY 2012 to the rate year. The rate of 10% is consistent with the recommendations from the District's consultant. Furthermore, the 10% rate is the same percentage increase used to increase the rate year employee's health insurance as presented on DGB-5. It appears when the Health Care-Others was calculated on DGB-3, before ultimately the percentage was finalized by the consultant, using a percentage increase of 12%. The amount listed on DIV 1-28 is the correct balance.
