Div. 1-2: Reference the HJS Schedule B-7 Update. Please explain the basis for using different periods and not the most recent periods for each of the following:

- a. Annual Production (average of 2008-2010);
- b. Maximum Production Month (average 2008-2010);
- c. Maximum Day Production (average 2008-2010); and
- d. Maximum Hour (2011 only).

Response:

It was my intent to remain as consistent as possible with the model the parties agreed to in Docket 4128. For that reason, with the exception of the Maximum Hour value, the values for the items listed above used in the model are those the parties agreed to in Docket 4128. The value for Maximum Hour was inadvertently changed when I updated the schedule. I will replace this with the average from 2008 through 2010 in my

rebuttal testimony.

Div. 1-3: Please identify whether there were any changes to the cost allocation

procedures for fire protection from those used in the cost of service

study approved in the settlement in Docket No. 4128.

Response: Except for the way in which costs associated with the water treatment

plant DB projects are allocated to all categories and classes, there were no changes to the cost allocation procedures for fire protection from those used in the cost of service study approved in the settlement in

Docket No. 4128.

Div. 1-4:

Please identify the basis for the significant decrease in the fire protection cost of service from that in Docket No. 4128 in light of the fact that the peak hour percent for fire protection (Demand + Peaks tab, cell N98 in the cost of service model) increased from 35 to 46 percent, and the decrease in the maximum hour percentage (AllocBases tab, cell L9 in the cost of service model) from 22 to 10 percent only appears to account for about 20 percent of the decrease in the fire cost of service.

Response:

The costs allocated for recovery from Fire Protection charges in the updated COS model submitted with my supplemental direct testimony on October 25, 2012 are actually greater than the costs allocated to Fire Protection in the COS model agreed to in Docket 4128.

As shown on Joint Schedule B-2 of Exhibit B to the Settlement Agreement in Docket 4128, \$635,222 is allocated to Fire Protection while \$757,203 is allocated to Fire Protection in the current COS model as shown on HJS Schedule – B2 Update

Div. 1-5: Should cell I188 under the "Allocations" tab in the cost of service study say "Maximum Hour Demand Patterns"?

Response: Yes, that cell should say "Maximum Hour Demand Patterns".
