ORDER

I. Introduction

The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid currently procures Standard Offer Service (SOS) supply on behalf of its customers pursuant to the 2014 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) on June 28, 2013. Pursuant to the 2014 SOS Procurement Plan, National Grid conducts solicitations throughout the year for Standard Offer Service in varying contract lengths. As a result of these solicitations, the Company files SOS rates for the Residential Group and the Commercial Group twice per year, and SOS rates for the Industrial Group on a quarterly basis.

II. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Commercial Group and Residential Group for the period January 2014 through June 2014.

On November 21, 2013, National Grid proposed a fixed commercial rate of \$0.08564 for the Commercial Group for the period January 2014 through June 2014.² The rate includes the Standard Offer Adjustment Factor of \$0.00094/kWh and an Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00101/kWh.³ This rate represents an increase of \$0.01614/kWh, or 23.2% from the current fixed commercial SOS rate of \$0.06950/kWh.⁴

The Company proposed the following variable commercial SOS rates:⁵

January 2014: \$0.12188/kWh February 2014: \$0.12062/kWh March 2014: \$0.07831/kWh April 2014: \$0.06340/kWh May 2014: \$0.05882/kWh June 2014: \$0.06386/kWh

For the Residential Group, the Company proposed a fixed standard offer charge of \$0.08372/kWh, which includes a Standard Offer Adjustment Credit Factor of \$0.00087/kWh and an Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00104/kWh. This represents an increase of \$.01805/kWh or 27.5% when compared to the current Standard Offer Charge of \$0.06567/kWh.⁶ The monthly bill for the typical residential customer using 500 kWh per month would increase \$9.40 or 11.9%.⁷

On December 3, 2013, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers (Division) filed a memorandum finding that the proposed SOS commercial rates for the period January 2014 through June 2014, and the proposed SOS Commercial groups for the period January 2014 through June 2014, were in compliance with the 2014 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the PUC on June 28, 2013. On December 18, 2013, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Commercial Group for the period January 2014 through June 2014 and the proposed SOS rates for the Residential Group for the period January 2014 through June 2014.

III. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Industrial Group for the period April 2014 through June 2014.

On February 24, 2014, National Grid proposed the following SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period April 2014 through June 2014:9

April 2014: \$0.07817/kWh May 2014: \$0.06198/kWh June 2014: \$0.07893/kWh

These rates include the Standard Offer Adjustment Credit Factor of \$0.00487/kWh and the Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00069kWh. The three-month average of the proposed industrial rates is \$0.07303/kWh.¹⁰ The three-month average for the period December 2013 through March 2014 was \$0.09589k/Wh. The SOS industrial rates proposed for the period April 2014 through June 2014 represent a decrease of \$0.02286/kWh.¹¹

On March 20, 2014, the Division filed a memorandum finding that the proposed SOS industrial rates for the period April 2014 through June 2014 were in compliance with the 2014 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the PUC on June 28, 2013.¹² On March 27, 2014, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted unanimously to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period April 2014 through June 2014.¹³

IV. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Industrial Group for the period July 2014 through September 2014.

On May 27, 2014, National Grid proposed the following SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period July 2014 through September 2014:¹⁴

July 2014: \$0.08299/kWh August 2014: \$0.07574/kWh September 2014: \$0.06645/kWh

These rates include the Standard Offer Adjustment Credit Factor of \$0.00360/kWh and the Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00139/kWh. The three-month average of the proposed industrial rates is \$0.07506/kWh.¹⁵ The three-month average for the period April 2014 through June 2014 was \$0.07499k/Wh. The SOS industrial rates proposed for the period July 2014 through September 2014 represent an increase of \$0.00007/kWh.¹⁶

On March 21 2014, the Division filed a memorandum finding that the proposed SOS industrial rates for the period July 2014 through September 2014 were in compliance with the 2014 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the PUC on June 28, 2013.¹⁷ On June 10, 2014, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted unanimously to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period July 2014 through September 2014.¹⁸

V. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Commercial Group and Residential Group for the period July 2014 through December 2014.

On May 27, 2014, National Grid filed its proposal for Standard Offer rates for both the Commercial and Residential Groups.¹⁹ National Grid proposed a fixed commercial rate for the Commercial Group for the period July 2014 through December 2014 of \$0.08801 kWh.²⁰ The rate includes the Standard Offer Adjustment Factor of \$0.0037/kWh and an Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00162/kWh. This rate represents a decrease of \$0.001/kWh, or 1.1%, from the current fixed commercial SOS rate of \$0.08901/kWh.²¹

The Company proposed the following variable commercial SOS rates:

July 2014: \$0.08526/kWh August 2014: \$0.08129/kWh September 2014: \$0.07049/kWh October 2014: \$0.07085/kWh November 2014: \$0.09329/kWh December 2014: \$0.13134/kWh²²

For the Residential Group, the Company proposed a fixed standard offer charge of \$0.07879/kWh which includes a Standard Offer Adjustment Credit Factor of \$0.00171/kWh and an Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00155/kWh..²³ This represents a decrease of \$.00802/kWh, or 9.2%, when compared to the current Standard Offer Charge of \$0.08681/kWh.²⁴ The monthly bill for the typical residential customer using 500 kWh per month would decrease \$4.17 or 4.6%.²⁵

On June 17, 2104 the Division filed a revised memorandum finding that the proposed SOS Commercial Group rates for the period July 2014 through December 2014, and the proposed SOS

Residential Group rates for the period July 2014 through December 2014, were in compliance with the 2014 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the PUC on June 28, 2013.²⁶ On June 30, 2014, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Commercial Group for the period July 2014 through December 2014 and the proposed SOS rates for the Residential Group for the period July 2014 through December 2014.²⁷

VI. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Industrial Group for the period October 2014 through December 2014

On August 22, 2014, National Grid proposed the following SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period October 2014 through December 2014:²⁸

October 2014: \$0.05319/kWh November 2014: \$0.07067/kWh December 2014: \$0.14105/kWh

These rates include the Standard Offer Adjustment Credit Factor of \$0.00360/kWh and the Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00139.²⁹ The three-month average of the proposed industrial rates is \$0.08830/kWh.³⁰ The three-month average for the period July 2014 through September 2014 was \$0.07506k/Wh. The SOS industrial rates proposed for the period October 2014 through December 2014 represent an increase of \$0.01324, or 17.6%, over the period July 20154 through September 2014.³¹

On September 9, 2014, the Division filed a memorandum finding that the proposed SOS industrial rates for the period October 2014 through December 2014 were in compliance with the

2014 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the PUC on June 28, 2013.³² On September 19, 2014, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted unanimously to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period October 2014 through December 2014.³³

Accordingly, it is hereby

- 3. The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid's proposed Standard Offer Service rates for the Commercial Group and Residential Group for the period July 2014 through December 2014 are hereby approved as filed.
- 4. The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid's proposed Standard Offer Service rates for the Industrial Group for the period July through September 2014 are hereby approved as filed.
- 5. The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid's proposed Standard Offer Service rates for the Industrial Group for the period October through December 2014 are hereby approved as filed.
