NOTICE OF TECHNICAL SESSIONS

Pursuant to the provisions of the Rhode Island General Laws §§39-1 and 42-46-6, as amended, the Public Utilities Commission (“Commission”) hereby gives notices that will conduct Technical Sessions on the above docket matter. The Commission initiated this docket pursuant Rhode Island General Laws §39-26-6(d). The law requires that the Commission determine on or before January 1, 2014, the adequacy or potential adequacy of renewable energy supplies to meet the increase in percentage requirement of energy from renewable energy supplies to go into effect in 2015. To assist the Commission in making such determination, the Commission will conduct a Technical Session on **August 27, 2013 @ 10:00 A.M. and October 3, 2013 @ 10:00 A.M.** in Hearing Room A of the Public Utilities Commission located at 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island.

At the August 27, 2013 technical session, ISO New England will present its analysis of renewable portfolio standards (RPS) and related renewable goals in New England developed for the forthcoming 2013 Regional System Plan, including proposed renewable generation projects in the ISO's Generator Interconnection Study Queue. On October 3, 2013, National Grid and Obligated Entities will present an analysis of their renewable portfolio and renewable energy obligations.

Reference is also made to Chapters 42-35 and 39-1 of the Rhode Island General Laws. Specifically Sections, 42-35-1, 42-35-2, 43-35-3, 42-35-4, 42-35-5, 39-1-1, 39-1-3, 39-1-11, 39-1-18 and 39-1-38.
