KCWA'S AMENDED MOTION
TO PASS THROUGH WATER WHOLESALE RATE
INCREASE/COMPLIANCE FILING

Now comes the KENT COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY (KCWA) and hereby files its Amended Request to pass through the wholesale rate increase requested by Providence Water Supply Board (PWSB) in Docket No. 4406. KCWA previously filed a Motion to Pass Through based on PWS's original rate request. Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the proposed Settlement Agreement:

KCWA makes its Motion to Pass Through a Wholesale Rate Increase pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws 39-3-38.1 which provides as follows:

§ 39-3-38.1 Rate adjustments — Purchase and sale of water between regulated water supply boards. — Regulated water supply boards which purchase wholesale water from another regulated water supply board may impose a retail rate increase provided the public utilities commission has approved the wholesale rate increase. The total amount of the retail rate so imposed shall not exceed the amount of the wholesale rate increase. The proposed retail rate increase to be applied by the wholesale purchaser shall be submitted no less than thirty (30) days prior to its effective date to the public utilities commission for its review and approval.

Attached hereto, As Exhibit A., is pre-filed Amended Testimony of Mr. Christopher P.N. Woodcock, together with exhibits in support of this Motion and the proposed rate schedules and revenue schedules, each of which is incorporated herein by reference. This Motion to Pass

Through a Wholesale Rate Increase is based upon the compliance filing of the PWSB (Docket 4406) for Supplemental rate relief which would increase wholesale price of water by 2.0% from \$1,697.21 per million gallons to \$1,731.16 per million gallons, which will result in increased purchased water expenses of \$90,063.00 per year. As detailed in the attached Exhibit A., the proposed pass through will result in a rate increase in KCWA's metering rates in order to meet increase annual expenses.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to § 39-3-38.1 Rate adjustments, KCWA hereby requests that the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission grant Petitioner's Motion to Pass Through a Wholesale Rate Increase as it relates to any wholesale increase granted to PWSB in Docket No. 4406, such pass through relief to be effective the 1st day of July, 2013, or at a date to be set by the Commission as resulting from the Order of PUC Docket No. 4406.

4	Q:	Are you the same Christopher Woodcock that submitted prefiled testimony in
5		this docket?
6	A:	Yes.
7	Q:	Have you updated the impact on the Kent County Water Authority's rates and
8		charges as a result of the proposed settlement in Docket No. 4406 (Provi-
9		dence Water)?.
10	A:	Yes I have. There was a considerable reduction in the wholesale water rate as a
11		result of the settlement in that docket. The wholesale customers will have only a
12		2% increase in the wholesale rate.
13	Q:	Have you adjusted the schedules you had initially filed to reflect this
14		change??
15	A:	Yes. The revised and updated schedules are attached. As shown on UPDATED
16		Schedule 2, only a 0.54% increase in the Authority's metered rate is required to re-
17		cover the increased Providence Water wholesale rate. This increase is shown for
18		the metered rates in UPDATED Schedule 2. The impact on customers is presented
19		in UPDATED Schedule 3. The proposed new rates and charges reflecting the pass

through of the Providence Water increase are shown on UPDATED Schedule 4.
