NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Pursuant to the provisions of R.I.G.L. §§ 39-1-1 and 39-3-11, as amended, the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) will conduct a hearing on <u>Tuesday, March 25, 2014 @ 9:30 A.M.</u> in Hearing Room A at the PUC's office located 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island.

In this docket, the PUC will examine National Grid's proposal to implement rate changes contained in the Company's 2014 Annual Retail Rate Filing and 2014 Renewable Energy Standard (RES) Charge Filing for effect April 1, 2014. The Company's filings propose rate changes that arise out of the reconciliation of the Company's Standard Offer Service (SOS), the SOS Administrative Adjustment Provision, transmission expenses pursuant to the Transmission Service Cost Adjustment Provision, and the calculation of its transition charge pursuant to its Non-Bypassable Transition Charge Adjustment Provision. These tariff provisions provide for the reconciliation and recovery of actual revenues and expenses incurred by the Company for the period January 2013 through December 2013 and estimated revenues and expenses projected to be incurred from April 1, 2014 through March 31, 2015. Additionally, the Company proposes rate adjustments arising out of the reconciliation of the Net Metering Provision, the Long-Term Contracting for Renewable Energy Recovery Provision, and the calculation of the RES Charge. Lastly, the Company is proposing to revise the Standard Offer Service Tariff and the Rate G-32 Large Demand Rate to reflect minor corrections to the tariffs.

If approved, the combined net impact of the proposed rate changes on a typical residential customer using 500 kWh per month is an increase of \$2.21 from \$88.28 to \$90.49 or approximately 2.5%. The PUC may approve different rates that may be higher or lower than those proposed by National Grid.

The filings and proposed rate changes may be examined at the PUC's office. The filings can also be accessed under the PUC's Docket Menu at <u>www.ripuc.org</u>, Docket Nos. 4485 and 4393. Reference is made to Chapters 39-1, 39-3 and 42-35 of the Rhode Island General Laws.
