RE: National Grid RI SOS Billing Adjustment - Docket 4556

Dear Ms. Massaro,

North American Power respectfully submits its public comment, to be filed in Docket 4556, with re: to the Commission's upcoming vote to decide [among other issues] whether to eliminate the SOS recovery charge/billing adjustment.

It is the position of North American Power that National Grid's May 8th testimony in this docket - in which they offered to cease collecting the SOS billing adjustment - should be a call to take immediate action to suspend billings adjustment charges (even before the Commission issues its Decision/Order following the June 4th public hearing) so that Rhode Island citizens may have a choice, in the interim, regarding their electric supply without worry of incurring the billing adjustment at issue.

In further support, John Farley's May 8th testimony on behalf of the Lt. Governor states (on pages 8, 23 and 24) his recommendation to both cease this practice and further to refund accounts. Clearly National Grid has changed their prior position, which was the only reason the Billing Adjustment charges were put in place. Any further delay in action would not appear to be in the best interest of consumer advocacy.
