| 7 | Α. | James McCaughey. My business address is the Narragansett Bay Commission, |

| 10 | Q. | For whom are you employed and what is your position? |
| 11 | A. | I am employed by the Narragansett Bay Commission (NBC) as its Environmental |
| 12 | | Safety and Technical Assistance Manager. |

| 14 | Q. | For how long have you been so employed? |
| 15 | A. | I was hired by NBC in 1992 as the Pollution Prevention Manager. In 2006, my |
| 16 | | title was modified to Environmental Safety and Technical Assistance Manager as |
| 17 | | my duties and responsibilities were modified to include management of NBC's |
| 18 | | Energy Management Program, Environmental Health and Safety Program, and |
| 19 | | Pollution Prevention Program. Prior to my employment with NBC, I worked for |
| 20 | | Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management for eight years |

| 24 | Q. | Can you briefly describe your educational and professional training |
| 25 | | background? |
| 26 | A. | Yes. I have more than 30 years working as a professional engineer. I have B.S. |
| 27 | | and M.S. degrees in Chemical Engineering from the University of Rhode Island. I |
| 28 | | also have a M.A. degree in Mathematics from Providence College. Lam also a |

licensed Professional Engineer in the State of Rhode Island and Board Certified by the American Academy of Environmental Engineers. I also serve as an Adjunct Professor of Chemistry, Mathematics, and Engineering at the Community College of Rhode Island where I have developed courses in wastewater treatment and energy management.

Q. Have you previously testified before the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission?

9 A. Yes, I provided testimony regarding the status of NBC's renewable energy projects before the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission as part of Docket 4562.

Q. What is the purpose of your testimony?

14 A. To provide the PUC with information regarding the potential adverse impact on
15 NBC and its ratepayers that would result from the implementation of the Access
16 Fee proposed by National Grid.

Q. Can you please provide some background regarding NBC's renewable energy initiatives?

Yes. NBC has a keen interest in renewable energy for two reasons. First, the NBC has significant electrical energy requirements associated with the operation of pumps, aerators and other equipment used in its wastewater collection and treatment process. NBC is interested in reducing operating costs through the procurement of lower-cost energy and mitigating ratepayer burden through Renewable Energy Credit (REC) revenues derived from renewable energy sources. Second, as a utility regulated by the Environmental Protection Agency and the Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management, NBC is proactively seeking renewable energy resources in anticipation of future regulatory requirements that may mandate NBC's carbon footprint reduction.

NBC entered the renewable energy arena with the construction and operation of three 1.5 MW wind turbines at Field's Point. As of July, 2015, these wind turbines have generated more than 19,321,958 kWh of electricity. Additionally, the on-site generation of this clean renewable energy has resulted in 16,565 in Renewable Energy Credits with a value of \$1,023,522.

During the 2015 legislative session, Rhode Island's net-metering laws were amended to allow for off-site generation of renewable energy by municipalities and public entities such as NBC. Given NBC's success with the Field's Point wind turbine project, NBC solicited proposals through an RFQ/P process for renewable energy projects. As a result of that process, NBC is now in the process of finalizing and executing a Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) for up to two 5MW solar energy projects. NBC is also evaluating other renewable energy opportunities.

Q. What are NBC's concerns with respect to National Grid's Access Fee proposal?

NBC has two concerns. First, it is unreasonable to apply this Access Fee to projects that have already been constructed and are in operation. Although the Access Fee would not impact NBC's wind turbines, NBC is concerned how this may impact future investment for renewable energy projects in the State of Rhode Island. These projects typically involve significant capital expenditures and investors will be reluctant to make these investments if the economics of the project can be significantly altered through the imposition of new costs and fees not in effect when the feasibility of a project is determined.

NBC also has concerns about applying this Access Fee to new projects. As I mentioned earlier in my testimony, NBC is in the process of negotiating a PPA for up to two 5MW solar energy projects. NBC estimates that the Access Fee, as

- proposed, could increase the annual costs from \$120,000 to \$360,000 or from \$3,000,000 to \$9,000,000 over the life of the contract (see table below).
