Attached are clean and red lined final revised tariffs for A & R Marine. These revisions take care of the typographical errors or ambiguities pointed out by the Commission at today's open meeting, as well as one additional clarification that we found in making these revisions.

1. Item 240

We have changed "12" to " $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

2. <u>Rule 9</u>

We have changed the word "and" to "an" in the middle of the paragraph.

3. Item 285

We agree the 1-year language was at best ambiguous and we are unaware of a purpose for this. This is a hold over from the old tariffs and it does not appear to presently serve any function, so we deleted it.

4. <u>Rule 1</u>

We have deleted the reference to pets because, as was pointed out at the open meeting, all pets are animals. We have also made it clear that only small animals and service animals may be carried in the passenger cabin.

5. Rule 10 and Schedule C

We have clarified, as set forth in the Division's proposal that we accepted and the PUC approved, that frequent user vehicle tickets will now be made available to Cars, SUVs, Vans and Pickups under 1 ton. Therefore we have changed the word "Cars" to "Vehicles" in Schedule C and Rule 10, and we have defined "Vehicles" to include Cars, SUVs, Vans and Pickups under 1 ton in Rule 10.

Hopefully the above revisions clear up the issues that the Commission pointed out in its review of the tariffs.

RULE NO. 1 ANIMALS ACCOMPANYING PASSENGERS:

Animals will not be allowed to accompany passengers aboard ships unless such animals are securely under leash. Only small animals and service animals may be carried in the passenger cabin.

RULE NO. 2 ARTICLES IN AUTOMOBILES:

Carrier will not be responsible for articles left in automobiles when not loaded in car trunks.

RULE NO. 3 TIME LIMIT ON SUITS:

Suits to recover on any claim for loss of life or bodily injury must be instituted within one (1) year from the day when the death or injury occurred. Suits to recover on any claim other than loss of life or bodily injury, including breach of contract, must be instituted within six (6) months of the scheduled arrival of the passenger or property at destination.

RULE NO. 4 ARTICLES LEFT ABOARD VESSEL:

Carrier will not be responsible for articles left aboard the vessel. Such shipments shall be charged for at the minimum rates provided in the company's tariffs.

RULE NO. 5 DAMAGE TO VEHICLES:

All vehicles are transported at owner's sole risk. Drivers must accompany vehicles. The company will not be responsible for any damages to vehicles while in transport or while they are being loaded and unloaded aboard the vessel. The owner or driver must drive the vehicle on and off the vessel. In the event a vessel is canceled, the vehicle reservation is also canceled. Any alleged damage to vehicles shall be reported to vessel's officers prior to leaving dock at destination.

RULE NO. 6 RESERVATIONS:

Web reservations are available for passenger and non-commercial vehicles only. Commercial vehicles must call or visit the office on Prudence Island during normal weekday business hours to make reservations. Reservations are not guaranteed until an email confirmation or transaction number is received by the customer. All vehicles with a reservation must be at the dock with printed confirmation and checked in line 15-MINUTES prior to departure time. Failure to do so could result in reservation forfeiture.

RULE NO. 7 CAR AND NON-COMMERCIAL TRUCK RESERVATION CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES:

Reservations may be changed or cancelled in person at both terminals. Reservations may be changed 2 full days in advance of departure, with no additional fee. Reservations may be cancelled 2 full days in advance of departure, for a full refund. Changes made within 2 days of departure will be assessed an administrative fee of \$5.00 for each change. Cancellations may be exchanged for reservations for cancellations made within 2 full days of departure for an administrative fee of \$5.00 for each change for reservations are not guaranteed until a transaction number is received by the customer. A maximum of three exchanged cancellations may be held at one time. No refunds will be made for cancellations made within 2 full days in advance of departure.

RULE NO. 8 COMMERCIAL RESERVATION CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES:

Reservations may be changed 2 full days in advance of departure, with no additional fee. Reservations may be cancelled 2 full days in advance of departure, for a full refund. Changes or cancellations made the day before the departure will be assessed a cancellation fee of 50% of the vehicle rate for each cancellation. No refunds will be made for cancellations made the same day of departure.

RULE NO. 9 NON-STANDARD VEHICLE CHARGES:

Vehicles that require more than one car space (such as limousines or long transit trucks less than 1 ton) may be charged an increased rate to compensate for the additional deck space required for the vehicle as opposed to a standard car or SUV. A standard car is no more than 18' long. Vehicles under 1 ton that are over this length will pay an additional \$3.65 per foot over 18' long, but the total not to exceed the 1 ton truck rate. The overall length of the vehicle will include any rack or any trailer that extends beyond a standard car length.

RULE NO. 10 FREQUENT USER ADVANCE TICKET DISCOUNT:

Carrier may sell advance tickets for passengers and vehicles (Car and SUV, Van, Pickup under 1 ton). Passenger tickets are available on cards of 20 which must be used within 60 days and cards of 10 which must be used within 30 days. Vehicle tickets are available on cards of 6 which must be used within 60 days. All individual tickets for both passenger and vehicles cover only a one way trip. Passenger tickets are also non-transferable between passengers and Photo ID is required to use. Vehicle tickets are also non-transferable between vehicles and are assigned to only one vehicle registration.

RULE NO. 100 COMMODITIES - USCG REGULATIONS:

Shipments of kerosene, propane, gasoline, and any other inflammable material or empty containers for the same will only be accepted for transportation on Company's vessels subject to United States Coast Guard Regulations.

RULE NO. 101 COMMODITIES - HOUSEHOLD GOODS:

Packages containing personal effects and household items, for which rates are published in Item No. 190, must be securely packaged and containers must be strongly secured to prevent damage.

RULE NO. 102 COMMODITIES - REFRIGERATORS:

Refrigerators, when shipped loose, must be accompanied by matting to prevent any damage to the exterior of the refrigerator.

RULE NO. 103 COMMODITIES - LIABILITY FOR FEEDING LIVESTOCK:

Shippers of livestock will provide feed and water and will accompany such animals, when transportation is in effect.

RULE NO. 104 COMMODITIES - MINIMUM CHARGES:

Rates published in this tariff are subject to a minimum charge of fifty (50) cents per shipment.

RULE NO. 105 COMMODITIES – WHEN NOT SUBJECT TO RATES:

Commodities shall not be subjected to rate charges if carried onto the vessel in a single boarding by a fare-paying passenger or vehicle and carried off the vessel in a single debarking by a farepaying passenger or vehicle.

RULE NO. 1 PETS OR ANIMALS ACCOMPANYING PASSENGERS:

Animals or pets will not be allowed to accompany passengers aboard ships unless such animals are securely under leash. Also, animals cannot Only small animals and service animals may be carried in the passenger cabin.

RULE NO. 2 ARTICLES IN AUTOMOBILES:

Carrier will not be responsible for articles left in automobiles when not loaded in car trunks.

RULE NO. 3 TIME LIMIT ON SUITS:

Suits to recover on any claim for loss of life or bodily injury must be instituted within one (1) year from the day when the death or injury occurred. Suits to recover on any claim other than loss of life or bodily injury, including breach of contract, must be instituted within six (6) months of the scheduled arrival of the passenger or property at destination.

RULE NO. 4 ARTICLES LEFT ABOARD VESSEL:

Carrier will not be responsible for articles left aboard the vessel. Such shipments shall be charged for at the minimum rates provided in the company's tariffs.

RULE NO. 5 DAMAGE TO VEHICLES:

All vehicles are transported at owner's sole risk. Drivers must accompany vehicles. The company will not be responsible for any damages to vehicles while in transport or while they are being loaded and unloaded aboard the vessel. The owner or driver must drive the vehicle on and off the vessel. In the event a vessel is canceled, the vehicle reservation is also canceled. Any alleged damage to vehicles shall be reported to vessel's officers prior to leaving dock at destination.

RULE NO. 6 RESERVATIONS:

Web reservations are available for passenger and non-commercial vehicles only. Commercial vehicles must call or visit the office on Prudence Island during normal weekday business hours to make reservations. Reservations are not guaranteed until an email confirmation or transaction number is received by the customer. All vehicles with a reservation must be at the dock with printed confirmation and checked in line 15-MINUTES prior to departure time. Failure to do so could result in reservation forfeiture.

RULE NO. 7 CAR AND NON-COMMERCIAL TRUCK RESERVATION CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES:

Reservations may be changed or cancelled in person at both terminals. Reservations may be changed 2 full days in advance of departure, with no additional fee. Reservations may be cancelled 2 full days in advance of departure, for a full refund. Changes made within 2 days of departure will be assessed an administrative fee of \$5.00 for each change. Cancellations may be exchanged for reservations for cancellations made within 2 full days of departure for an administrative fee of \$5.00 for each change administrative fee of \$5.00 for each change. Cancellations may be exchanged for reservations for cancellation. Exchanged cancellations for reservations are not guaranteed until a transaction number is received by the customer. A maximum of three exchanged cancellations may be held at one time. No refunds will be made for cancellations made within 2 full days in advance of departure.

RULE NO. 8 COMMERCIAL RESERVATION CANCELLATIONS AND CHANGES:

Reservations may be changed 2 full days in advance of departure, with no additional fee. Reservations may be cancelled 2 full days in advance of departure, for a full refund. Changes or cancellations made the day before the departure will be assessed a cancellation fee of 50% of the vehicle rate for each cancellation. No refunds will be made for cancellations made the same day of departure.

RULE NO. 9 NON-STANDARD VEHICLE CHARGES:

Vehicles that require more than one car space (such as limousines or long transit trucks less than 1 ton) may be charged an increased rate to compensate for the additional deck space required for the vehicle as opposed to a standard car or SUV. A standard car is no more than 18' long. Vehicles under 1 ton that are over this length will pay and an additional \$3.65 per foot over 18' long, but the total not to exceed the 1 ton truck rate. The overall length of the vehicle will include any rack or any trailer that extends beyond a standard car length.

RULE NO. 10 FREQUENT USER ADVANCE TICKET DISCOUNT:

Carrier may sell advance tickets for passengers and <u>ears vehicles (Car and SUV, Van, Pickup under 1 ton)</u>. Passenger tickets are available on cards of 20 which must be used within 60 days and cards of 10 which must be used within 30 days. <u>Car Vehicle</u> tickets are available on cards of 6 which must be used within 60 days. All individual tickets for both passenger and <u>ears vehicles</u> cover only a one way trip. Passenger tickets are also non-transferable between passengers and Photo ID is required to use. Vehicle tickets are also non-transferable between vehicles and are assigned to only one vehicle registration.

RULE NO. 100 COMMODITIES - USCG REGULATIONS:

Shipments of kerosene, propane, gasoline, and any other inflammable material or empty containers for the same will only be accepted for transportation on Company's vessels subject to United States Coast Guard Regulations.

RULE NO. 101 COMMODITIES - HOUSEHOLD GOODS:

Packages containing personal effects and household items, for which rates are published in Item No. 190, must be securely packaged and containers must be strongly secured to prevent damage.

RULE NO. 102 COMMODITIES - REFRIGERATORS:

Refrigerators, when shipped loose, must be accompanied by matting to prevent any damage to the exterior of the refrigerator.

RULE NO. 103 COMMODITIES - LIABILITY FOR FEEDING LIVESTOCK:

Shippers of livestock will provide feed and water and will accompany such animals, when transportation is in effect.

RULE NO. 104 COMMODITIES - MINIMUM CHARGES:

Rates published in this tariff are subject to a minimum charge of fifty (50) cents per shipment.

RULE NO. 105 COMMODITIES – WHEN NOT SUBJECT TO RATES:

Commodities shall not be subjected to rate charges if carried onto the vessel in a single boarding by a fare-paying passenger or vehicle and carried off the vessel in a single debarking by a farepaying passenger or vehicle.
