As you know, this office represents A & R Marine Corp., d/b/a Prudence & Bay Islands Transport (A & R).


Enclosed for filing are the original and nine (9) copies of the following:

TRANSPORT FOR LEAVE TO AMEND PURSUANT TO RULE 1.11**


After A & R Marine Corp. d/b/a Prudence & Bay Islands Transport (A & R) made this rate filing, Prudence Island year-round residents asked A & R to propose Prudence Islander year-round Resident discount rates, similar to the resident discount rates that are in effect for Block Island residents with the Interstate Navigation Company d/b/a The Block Island Ferry. A & R agreed to do so. Therefore, David Bebyn, CPA, has prepared the necessary schedules and supplemental testimony in order to support these proposed Prudence Islander resident discount rates.

In order to implement these Resident discount rates, it was necessary for A & R to add a year-round Resident Islander definition to its terms and conditions. In reviewing these terms and conditions, which have been effect for many years, A & R also realized that a number of them no longer applied and that there were new ones that should be added. These are explained in more detail in the testimony of Mr. Bebyn and in his attached schedules.

Accordingly, A & R hereby moves under Rule 1.11 to amend its filing to add the supplemental testimony of David Bebyn and his attached schedules which propose Prudence Islander year-round Resident discount rates, and to make certain amendments to A & R's terms and conditions.



1 **Q. Will you please provide your full name and your employer for the record?**

2 A. Yes, my name is David George Bebyn CPA. I am the president of B&E Consulting LLC.

4 **Q. Are you the same David Bebyn who filed direct testimony in this docket?**

5 A. Yes.

6

7 **Q. What is the purpose of this supplemental testimony?**

8 A. The primary purpose is to update portions of A&R's original filing and my direct testimony  
9 and schedules in order to propose a rate design change for new discounted Prudence Islander  
10 Resident rates for adults and also for Resident cars and SUVs/Vans/Pick-ups under 1 ton. In  
11 addition to this supplemental testimony and attached schedules, I am also submitting a revised  
12 tariff which includes a new definition in the terms and conditions which will define which  
13 Prudence Island ratepayers are eligible for these new Islander Resident rates. Furthermore, since  
14 changes were now being made to the terms and conditions, which have been in effect for many  
15 years, I took this opportunity to remove some items that no longer applied and to add new ones  
16 that should be included.

17

18 **Q. Why were these rate design issues not raised in your original direct testimony?**

19 A. Timing. A&R Marine Corp. (A&R) had just completed its first year of service in September  
20 of 2015 and had been operating at a loss under the rates previously approved for the Island's  
21 former ferry provider (Prudence Ferry Inc.) in Docket #2090. These old rates had been in effect  
22 since June 8, 1993. These rates are inadequate to cover the current operations, and A&R had to  
23 file a rate case as soon as possible in order to get new rates into effect by the summer of 2016. In  
24 order to file as quickly as possible, A&R opted to simplify the case by initially proposing to  
25 spread the increase across the board.

26

27 **Q. Why is A&R filing a rate design change proposing to implement Islander Resident  
28 discount rates?**

29 A. After A&R made this rate filing, A&R was approached by Prudence Island residents who  
30 asked A&R to propose Prudence Islander year round Resident discount rates. Although A&R  
31 has frequent user rates for adult passengers and cars (which is called a "commuter" rate in the

1 current tariff), these rates do not provide an adequate discount for a true lifeline service. For  
2 example, some residents who own SUVs, vans, or pick-up trucks currently do not receive any  
3 discount. Furthermore, in order to prevent non-frequent users from stockpiling tickets in  
4 advance, the frequent user tickets have an expiration period. This once again may disadvantage  
5 residents who may only travel off the island infrequently. As a result, A&R agreed to address  
6 this issue with this supplemental filing. A&R is looking to structure this discount to be similar to  
7 the Block Islander discount rate used by Interstate Navigation Company d/b/a The Block Island  
8 Ferry.

9  
10 **Q. Mr. Bebyn will this rate design change impact the overall revenue requirement**  
11 **originally requested?**

12 A. No. A&R is requesting the same increase in revenue requirement of \$564,409, which is a  
13 96.50% increase over the adjusted test year at current rates.

14  
15 **Q. Please provide the Commission with the detailed steps you took to develop the Resident**  
16 **discount rates.**

17 A. First, my calculations assume that each revenue source (passengers, vehicles, trailers,  
18 freight, and bikes) would still receive an across the board increase because I am still relying on  
19 the previous rate design structure. I utilized the previously calculated across the board increase  
20 of 102.19% presented in schedule DGB-13. As a result, the overall rates for trailers, freight and  
21 bikes have not changed from my original testimony.

22  
23 Second, I broke down the revenue sources which would be impacted by an Islander Resident  
24 discount. These would include a passenger discount and vehicle discounts similar to those  
25 Interstate Navigation uses. The vehicle rate will include a separate Resident rate for cars and  
26 another Resident rate for SUVs, vans, and pick-ups under 1 ton.

27  
28 Next, I prepared schedules for passenger rates (Schedule DGB-14a Supplemental) and vehicle  
29 rates (Schedule DGB-14b Supplemental) to determine the current revenue for both residents and  
30 non-residents. These schedules then present how much passengers and vehicles revenue will be  
31 covered by the new Resident discount rates.

1 Next, the schedules present the calculations for what the across the board increase will be for the  
2 remaining non-resident passengers and vehicles.

3  
4 Lastly, the current rates are multiplied by the across the board increase for all non-resident  
5 passengers and vehicles.

6  
7 Regarding the passenger rates, the proposed Islander Resident passenger discount rate was set at  
8 \$2.85, which is the current One-way Single Fare Adult rate. The proposed non-resident rate is  
9 \$5.90. Regarding the vehicle rates, there were two distinct issues. First, the proposed Islander  
10 Resident district car rate was set at \$15.50, which is the current One-way Passenger car with  
11 driver rate. The proposed non-resident rate is \$32.85. The other issue was for SUVs, vans, and  
12 pick-ups under 1 ton. As previously stated, there are no discounts currently available for any  
13 SUVs, vans, or pick-ups. Since the new Islander Resident discount passenger rate would  
14 generate an additional 60% more revenue than those using frequent user ticket cards, I calculated  
15 an increase of 60% over the current SUV/van/pickup rate of \$15.50. This resulted in a proposed  
16 Islander Resident discount SUV/van/pickup rate of \$24.75. The proposed non-resident  
17 undiscounted rate is \$32.85.

18

19 **Q. Who is eligible for the new Islander Resident discount rates?**

20 A. The Islander Resident discount rates are available to only full time (minimum 9 months of  
21 the year) residents of Prudence Island and their dependents who live in the same residence. A  
22 definition of what constitutes a full time resident and how residents can access this discount has  
23 been included in the attached new terms and conditions under Rule number 11. The language in  
24 this rule is very similar to the language in Interstate Navigation's current tariff.

25

26 **Q. Aside from the new Rule for Islander Resident discount rates, are there any other  
27 changes proposed in the terms and conditions?**

28 A. Yes. As I mentioned in my introduction, since I was adding language to include a Rule for  
29 this Resident discount, I took this opportunity to review the terms and conditions in detail and I  
30 removed some items that no longer applied and I added some new ones that should be included.

1 In addition, in the prior tariff there were two Rules that were placed on schedule A and the  
2 remainder were placed on schedule F. I have now consolidated all of the Rules on schedule F.

3

4 **Q. Mr. Bebyn what Rules were eliminated from the terms and conditions?**

5 A. The first Rule I eliminated was Rule 2 on schedule A of the prior tariff. This Rule covers the  
6 transportation of inflammable materials. This Rule was misplaced on this schedule since it  
7 covered commodities and Rule 1 on schedule F of the prior tariff covered this issue. The next  
8 Rule that was eliminated was Rule 2 on schedule F of the prior tariff that covered the  
9 transportation of pipe. A&R believes that A&R will be able to transport pipe under the  
10 conditions which this Rule prevented. Lastly, Rule 7 on schedule F of the prior tariff covering  
11 the transportation of vehicles at full tide is no longer an issue.

12

13 **Q. What additional rules were added to the terms and conditions?**

14 A. While reviewing the terms and conditions and utilizing Interstate Navigation's tariff for  
15 guidance, I noted that there were a number of company policies that were never clearly spelled  
16 out in A&R's terms and conditions. Some of these new Rules are generic, such as responsibility  
17 for articles left in vehicles or aboard the vessel, time limit on lawsuits, and damage to vehicles.  
18 The others were tailored to A&R's needs.

19

20 **Q. Can you describe the Rules that were added to the terms and conditions that were  
21 tailored to A&R?**

22 A. Certainly. The first Rule I would like to discuss is reservations. This new Rule defines  
23 which ratepayers may use the web reservation service. The Rule for reservations also details  
24 when they are guaranteed. Lastly, this Rule defines when vehicles have to be in the check in line  
25 prior to departure or risk reservation forfeiture.

26

27 The next two Rules (Rule 7 and 8 in the new tariff) cover cancellations and changes to  
28 reservations for commercial and non-commercial vehicles. Both of these rules define the  
29 number of days prior to departure when full refunds are available, the number of days prior to  
30 departure when changes can be made for a fee and when no refunds can be received. The Rule

1 covering cars and non-commercial vehicles also defines the process for how customers may  
2 exchange a cancellation for a future reservation for a fee.

3

4 I would next like to discuss the Rule for non-standard size vehicles. A&R's tariff, which was  
5 based on the Island's previous ferry provider (Prudence Ferry Inc.), handles vehicles based upon  
6 weight classes. This methodology seems to work fine in most cases. However, there are certain  
7 situations where vehicles under 1 ton are using a lot of additional deck space. Some of these  
8 situations arise from extended cabs on trucks, extra-long transit trucks and racks added to cars,  
9 SUVs, vans, and pick-ups. To cover these situations, a rate has been calculated using the  
10 proposed under 1 ton rate and dividing it by 18' which is the standard car length.

11

12 Lastly, I added a Rule for advance ticket discounts for frequent users. This Rule had been  
13 somewhat included in the prior tariff as notes on schedules A and C. This note now clearly  
14 defines in one Rule both the amounts and time limits of passenger and vehicle tickets. The note  
15 also reaffirms that tickets are non-transferable.

16

17 **Q. Does that conclude your supplemental testimony?**

18 A. Yes.

Only those who certify under oath that they are full time residents of Prudence Island, residing for at least nine (9) months per calendar year at a physical Prudence Island address (not a post office box) are eligible for the islander discount rate, provided that: (1) they also hold a current Rhode Island Registry of Motor Vehicles drivers' license of RI State ID issued by Rhode Island Registry of Motor Vehicles that has a Prudence Island address as the sole address on the license and present the license for inspection and copying (dependents of year-round residents also qualify until they establish a separate residence). 1. The Prudence & Bay Islands Transport Islander card must be renewed annually, and the holder must appear in person to obtain or renew your card. There is a \$10.00 fee to receive a replacement card.
2. Discounted islander resident tickets may be purchased at either ticket office, however, the Islander card must be presented to purchase these tickets.
3. If a Prudence Islander card is not available because the customer is not a full time Prudence Island resident, the customer can still purchase discounted (frequent user) tickets (cards of 10 and 20 for passengers and cards of 6 for cars).
4. Prudence & Bay Islands Transport also has reduced rates in effect for all children under 12 whether or not the children are full time Prudence Island residents.
