CITY OF NEWPORT, UTILITIES DIVISION, WATER DEPARTMENT'S MOTION TO REOPEN

I. INTRODUCTION

Now comes the City of Newport, Utilities Department, Water Division ("Newport" or "Newport Water") and files this Motion to Reopen pursuant to Rule 1.26 of the Rules of Practice and Procedure for the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"). Newport Water seeks reconsideration of an issue decided by the Commission at its September 20, 2016 Open Meeting related to revenue offsets.

II. PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On December 23, 2015, Newport Water filed an application to increase rates pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws § 39-3-11 and Part II of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. The Commission subsequently suspended Newport's proposed rates. In the interim, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers, the United States Navy and the Portsmouth Water and Fire District filed testimony and data requests. Hearings were held on July 19, 20 and August 2, 2016. The parties submitted post-hearing briefs on September 12, 2016, and the Commission issued its decision on September 20, 2016. As part of its decision, the Commission ordered that Newport withdraw \$100,000 from its restricted Electricity Account, and \$132,751¹ from its restricted Salary Increase Account, and transfer this money to the general operating fund to reduce Newport's request for revenue from rates. On September 22, 2016, Newport submitted a Compliance Filing as required by Commission Rule 2.11.² This filing showed the \$232,751 transfer from the restricted Electric and Salary Increase Accounts as a revenue offset, which lowered the amount of revenue Newport required from water sales to meet the expenses approved by the Commission in Fiscal Year 2017. However, the Commission only ordered a one-time transfer of funds from the Electric and Salary Increase Accounts.³ Thus, Newport will begin Fiscal Year 2018 with a built-in \$232,751 deficit to meet Commission approved expenses.

Newport could file a new rate case immediately to seek the restoration of \$232,751 in time for Fiscal Year 2018. To do so, Newport would have to incur considerable expense, which its ratepayers would bear. Newport does not wish to incur this cost because it is not certain the Commission intended to build in a deficit after Fiscal Year 2017. Furthermore, while Newport used Fiscal Year 2017 as the rate year in the filing, it is not restricted from collecting funds necessary to meet Commission approved expenses after the expiration of the rate year. There is no requirement that a utility file rate cases each and every year.

¹ The balance of this account as of 8/31/16 was \$206,151.72. The Commission approved Newport's Miscellaneous Petition to withdraw \$74,400.79 to cover salary increases in Fiscal Year 2016, leaving a balance of \$131,750.93.

² In its filing Newport requested an extension of the suspension period because it wished to address the issue raised in this Petition.

³ In fact, no funds will remain in the Salary Increase Account after Newport withdraws the \$131,750.93 ordered by the Commission.

Newport could also ask that the Commission rescind its order, and direct Newport to transfer the \$232,751 into another restricted account (e.g. Debt or Capital) to offset future rate increases. This would result in an increase to the rates presented in Newport's September 22, 2016 Compliance Filing. It would also frustrate the perceived goal of the Commission's Order – to begin reducing Newport's restricted accounts balances – because a transfer of this type would simply move funds from one restricted account to another.

Rather, Newport proposes to keep the \$232,751 revenue offset in place after Fiscal Year 2017, but fund it from the restricted Operating Revenue Reserve. The Commission ordered Newport to transfer \$300,000 from the restricted Accrued Benefits Account to the Operating Revenue Reserve. The Commission also ordered that Newport stop funding the restricted portion of the Operating Revenue Reserve.⁴ Following the transfer, Newport will have approximately \$1,088,660 in the restricted Operating Revenue Reserve. Thus, Newport proposes to use this account to continue funding the \$232,751 revenue offset until its next general rate filing. This will allow Newport to effectuate the rates in its September 22, 2016 Compliance Filing while drawing down funds from a restricted account.

As part of the requested relief, Newport would agree to a compliance mechanism, which would consist of the following:

- Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, Newport Water would be authorized to withdraw \$232,751 from the restricted Operating Revenue Reserve account.
- At the conclusion of the fiscal year, Newport Water will submit a reconciliation filing similar to that provided in the attached response to the Portsmouth Water and Fire

⁴ The Operating Revenue Reserve was previously calculated at 3% of Newport's operations and maintenance expenses. 1.5% of these funds were unrestricted, and 1.5% was restricted. At the September 20, 2016 Open Meeting, the Commission ordered that Newport continue funding the unrestricted portion, but discontinue funding the restricted portion.

District's First Set of Data Requests in Docket 4243 (Miscellaneous Petition For Relief), which shows the fiscal year expenses and revenues. (See Exhibit 1)

• If the reconciliation shows that Newport Water did not need some, or all, of the \$232,751 withdrawn from the Operating Revenue Reserve to cover a deficit, it will reimburse the Operating Revenue Reserve in the amount that was not needed.

III. CONCLUSION

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth hereinabove the City of Newport, Utilities

Department, Water Division, prays that the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission grant the

relief sought herein.
