### ORDER

### I. Introduction

The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid (National Grid or Company) currently procures Standard Offer Service (SOS) supply on behalf of its customers pursuant to the 2017 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) at an Open Meeting on June 27, 2016.<sup>1</sup> The procurement plan authorizes National Grid to conduct solicitations throughout the year for Standard Offer Service in varying contract lengths. Based on these solicitations, the Company files SOS rates for the Residential Group and Commercial Group twice per year and SOS rates for the Industrial Group quarterly.<sup>2</sup>

# II. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Industrial Group for the period January 2018 through March 2018

On October 13, 2017, National Grid proposed the following Industrial SOS rates for the

period January 2018 through March 2018:<sup>3</sup>

January 2018:	\$0.10522/kWh
February 2018:	\$0.10204/kWh
March 2018:	\$0.07567/kWh

These rates include the Standard Offer Adjustment Factor of (\$0.00507/kWh), the Administrative Cost Factor of \$0.00122/kWh, and the Renewable Energy Standard Charge of \$0.00040.<sup>4</sup> The three-month average of the proposed Industrial rates for the period January 2018 through March 2018 is \$0.09431/kWh. That represents a 46% increase from the three-month average rate of \$0.06440/kWh for the period October 2017 through December 2017.<sup>5</sup> The proposed average of \$0.09431/kWh is 26% higher than the average Industrial SOS rate of \$0.07499 for the same three-month period in the previous year.<sup>6</sup>

### III. Decision

On May 1, 2017, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers (Division) filed a memorandum concluding that the proposed SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period January 2018 through March 2018 are in compliance with the 2016 SOS Procurement Plan as modified by the PUC at an Open Meeting on June 27, 2016.<sup>7</sup> On November 21, 2017, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted unanimously to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Industrial Group for the period January 2018 through March 2018.
