Now comes the Kent County Water Authority ("KCWA"), and pursuant to RI General Laws §39-14.1-4, hereby gives the Rhode Island Public Utilities

Commission ("Commission") notice of its proposed change in rates in conformance with the multi-year rate plan authorized by the Commission in Docket No. 4611. In support of its proposed change in rates, the KCWA states as follows:

- KCWA is a public benefit corporation authorized by the Rhode Island Legislature with its principal place of business at 1072 Main Street, West Warwick, Rhode Island.
- 2. On April 7, 2016, KCWA filed a general rate application for a rate increase (Docket No. 4611).
- 3. In its application, pursuant to RI General Laws §39-15.1-4, KCWA proposed a multi-year rate plan through a three step increase effective in May 9, 2016 (step one); July 1, 2017 (step two); and July 1, 2018 (step three).
- 4. KCWA and the Division of Public Utilities and Commission ("Division") reached a Settlement Agreement in Docket 4611 which the Commission approved.

- 5. The Settlement Agreement consolidated the second and third steps of the multi-year rate increase into a single step rate increase effective January 1. 2018.
- 6. The Settlement Agreement provided for a rate increase in revenues not to exceed \$1,057,660.00 or 4.77%.
- 7. Since Docket 4611, KCWA was granted a revenue increase as a pass through of the increase in Providence Water's wholesale rate (Providence Water Docket 4618). That increase of \$185,690.00 was approved in Docket 4618.
- 8. With the interim pass through increase, KCWA only needs to increase its rate by 4.73% rather than the 4.77% in the approved Settlement Agreement in Docket 4611.
- 9. RI General Laws §39-15.1-4 requires KCWA to submit a compliance filing to the Commission before it implements the step rate increase.
- 10. KCWA submits notice that it will increase its rates by an amount not to exceed \$1,057,660.00 which is a 4.73% rate increase as approved by the Commission in Docket 4611.
- 11. Pursuant to RI General Laws §39-15.1-4, the increased rates will become effective January 1, 2018, unless the Commission decides that the proposed rate increase is unreasonable or inconsistent with the approved plan, in which case the Commission shall hold a hearing on the proposed rate increase and may approve, or reasonably amend the proposed rate increase.
- 12. In support of its notice of change and rates, KCWA incorporates the testimony and schedules of Christopher P.N. Woodcock submitted herewith.

WHEREFORE, KCWA respectfully request that the Commission approve its request for a 4.73% rate increase and all other relief this Commission deems just and proper.

NOTICE OF CHANGE IN RATE AND SCHEDULES IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN APPROVED MULTI-YEAR RATE PLAN TO KENT COUNTY WATER AUTHORITY CUSTOMERS

Pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws (R.I.G.L.), Sections 39-15.1-4, and in accordance with the Rules of Practice and Procedure of the Rhode Island Public Utilities Commission, the Kent County Water Authority ("KCWA") hereby gives notice of a proposed change in rates based on an approved multi-year plan previously approved by the Commission and consistent with the provisions of the plan.

In its filing, the KCWA seeks to implement the step increase in the multi-year rate plan pursuant to R.I.G.L. § 39-15.1-4. This step increase is, proposed to take effect on January 1, 2018. The KCWA's proposed rates are designed to collect additional operating revenue in the amount of \$1,057,660 to support total operating revenue requirements of \$23,434,296. The impact of this request for a typical residential customer who uses 2,000 cubic feet of water per quarter (166 gallons per day) will result in an increase of \$6.26 per quarter or 4.73%. The impact of the proposed rate increase on other customer classes will be an increase of 4.73%.

While the new rates requested under the step increase are proposed to become effective January 1, 2018, the Commission can suspend the rates up to eight months from the proposed effective date. No rate change will take effect until the Commission has conducted a review or hearing on the proposal. The Commission will publish a notice of the hearing dates when they are scheduled and if necessary.



4	Q:	Please state your name and business address?
5	A:	My name is Christopher P.N. Woodcock and my business address is 18 Increase Ward
6		Drive, Northborough, Massachusetts 01532.
7		
8	Q:	By whom are you employed and in what capacity?
9	A:	I am the President of Woodcock & Associates, Inc. a consulting firm specializing in water
10		and wastewater rate and financial studies.
11		
12	Q:	Are you the same Christopher Woodcock that submitted pre-filed direct and rebuttal tes-
13		timony as well as live testimony in Docket 4611?
14	A:	Yes I am.
15		
16	Q:	What is the purpose of your testimony in this docket?
17	A:	To support the Multi-Year Rate Plan Compliance Filing And Notice Of Change In Rates
18		Pursuant To R.I.G.L. § 39-15.1-4 filed by the Kent County Water Authority ("KCWA").
19		
20	Q.	Please provide an overview of the KCWA'S Compliance Filing?
21	A.	On April 7, 2016, the KCWA filed an application for a general rate increase (Docket 4611).
22		In its application, the KCWA proposed a multi-year rate plan pursuant to R.I.G.L. §39-15.1-
23		4. The parties in Docket 4611 presented a Settlement Agreement, which the Rhode Island
24		Public Utilities Commission ("Commission") approved. During the case proceedings, the
25		parties agreed to consolidate the multi-year step increase plan into a single step increase.
26		The Settlement Agreement provided for a step increase of \$1,057,660 or 4.77% to be effect
27		tive January 1, 2018.
28		

1		The KCWA submitted this Compliance filing pursuant to the Rhode Island General Laws,
2		and my testimony will address the step increase originally approved by the Commission in
3		Docket 4611.
4		
5	Q:	What is the amount of the KCWA's proposed step increase?
6	A:	The KCWA is proposing to increase its revenues by the \$1,057,660 that was included in the
7		Settlement Agreement. Since Docket 4611, the KCWA was also granted a revenue increase
8		as a pass through of the increase in Providence Water's wholesale rate (Providence Water
9		Docket 4618). That increase of \$185,690 was approved for the KCWA in Docket 4641. Be-
LO		cause of this interim pass through increase, the KCWA rates needs only increase by 4.73%
l1		rather than the 4.77% included in the Docket 4611 Settlement. I have included schedules
L 2		attached to this filing that present a 4.73% increase to all rates and charges.
L3		
L4		CW Step 1 Increase Sch. 1, attached to this testimony, presents the step increase proposed
15		by the KCWA. This is the same schedule included in the Settlement Agreement as page 1 of
16		Joint Settlement Sch. 15 in Docket 4611, except I have added the pass through increase of
L7		\$185,690 to the Docket 4611 revenue requirement.
18		
19		CW Step 1 Increase Sch. 2, attached to this testimony, presents the rates and charges ap-
20		proved in Docket 4611 as updated in Docket 4641, and the proposed step increase being
21		requested in this filing. This is the same schedule included in Docket 4611 except that I
22		have updated the KCWA's current metered rates for the pass-through increase of Provi-
23		dence Water's rates approved in Docket 4641.
24		

2		In preparing this filing did you review and compare the actual FY 17 expenses with those
3		that were estimated in Docket 4611?
4	A:	Yes I did. Because the capital items are restricted as to the amounts, I concentrated on the
5		KCWA operating expenses. CW Step 1 Increase Sch. 3 presents the summary of the rate
6		year (FY 2017) O&M expenses from Joint Settlement Schedule 12, the actual audited ex-
7		penses for FY 2017, and the differences. As this schedule shows, the actual O&M expenses
8		were just \$156,614 higher (1.5%) than those that were projected in the filing. We believe
9		that the unrestricted, 1.5% operating revenue allowance was sufficient to cover this differ-
10		ence.
11		
12		We did not include the impact of the increased wholesale rate in this exhibit because the
13		Providence increase occurred well into FY 2017.
14		
15	Q:	Were you able to examine the estimated rate year sales for FY 2017 with the actual retail
16		sales?
17	A:	Yes. In Docket 4611, we estimated rate year sales of 3,248,694 hundred cubic feet (ccf).
18		The actual sales in FY 2017 were 3,200,823 ccf, or some 1.5% less. Using the actual FY17
19		sales and the rates approved in Docket 4611 and 4641 results in a revenue shortfall of
20		about \$276,000.
21		
22	Q:	Are you proposing an adjustment to the sales in this filing?
23	A:	No. We believe this past summer likely had somewhat lower sales due to the weather. As
24		shown below, we plotted the retail sales and added a trend line for the past eight years
25		(since FY 2008).

1 Q: The rate year in Docket 4611 was the Authority's FY 2017 (July 1, 2016 – June 30, 2017).



We believe that the estimated volume used in Docket 4611 (3,248,694 ccf) is in line with what would normally expect. While the trend is somewhat downward, we expect that the FY 18 sales will be in line with those estimated in Docket 4611.

Q: What is KCWA requesting at this time?

7 A: We are requesting an overall rate adjustment of 4.73% consistent with the settlement agreement in Docket 4611. I have attached a schedule that shows the impacts of the step adjustments and the proposed new rates with the overall increase applied. As shown on CW Step 1 Increase Sch. 4, the impact on a typical customer's quarterly bill is a \$6.26 increase (\$2.09/month) or 4.73%.

13 Q: Under item #23 of the Settlement Agreement in Docket 4611, the KCWA agreed to up-14 date its production numbers. Have you done that?

15 A: Yes we have. The table on the following page is from my Sch. 1C in Docket 4611. I have 16 added the column for 2017 to that table (shown in red).
