**INTERVENOR CITY OF WARWICK'S POSITION STATEMENT** 

Now comes the City of Warwick ("Warwick"), by and through its City Solicitor, and

hereby provides this Position Statement concerning the Kent County Water Authority's Notice of

Proposed Tariff Change, Docket No.: 4611 ("KCWA") to increase its present rate structure to

obtain an amount not to exceed \$1,057,660 – a nearly 5 percent revenue increase - in additional

annual revenue effective January 1, 2018 (the "Revenue Increase"). As set forth in the Step

Increase Rate Filing, the KCWA seeks to obtain this revenue increase across the board from all

customers.

While the KCWA bases its Revenue Increase on the fact that a Settlement Agreement

was executed in Docket 4611, Warwick was not a signatory to the Settlement Agreement. In

addition, all municipalities in Rhode Island are statutorily limited to 4 percent levy increases –

why isn't the KCWA able to meet this guidepost to ease the burden on its ratepayers. In their

Revenue Increase, the KCWA offers no explanation or statement evidencing that they "at least

tried" to lower expenses to reduce the need for additional revenues from ratepayers. Essentially,

the increased revenues are needed due to the reduced sales of water. Rather than address

expenditures, the KCWA merely asks for more money to meet expenditures. Households are not

able to engage in this type of budget shortfall supplementation – why should a public entity.

On behalf of the Mayor of the City of Warwick, Warwick requests the Commission to

inquire of the need for the revenue increase in relation to determine what, if any, effort was made

by the KCWA to reduce expenses. The inquiry should determine why costs remain fixed and not

variably related to water sales volumes. Ratepayers must be protected from unneeded and unjustified revenue increases.
