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#### **ORDER**

## I. Introduction

The Narragansett Electric Company d/b/a National Grid (National Grid or Company) currently procures Standard Offer Service (SOS) supply on behalf of its customers pursuant to the 2018 SOS Procurement Plan approved by the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) at an open meeting on March 30, 2017.<sup>1</sup> The procurement plan authorizes National Grid to conduct solicitations throughout the year for Standard Offer Service in varying contract lengths.<sup>2</sup> Based on these solicitations, the Company files SOS rates for the Residential Group and Commercial Group twice per year and SOS rates for the Industrial Group quarterly.<sup>3</sup> The Company's proposed rates are designed to recover the cost of these procurements pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws §39-1-27.8. The Company derives no profit from the collection of standard offer service rates.<sup>4</sup>

II. National Grid's Proposed Standard Offer Service Rates for the Residential Group and Commercial Group for the period April 2018 through September 2018 and the Industrial Group for the period April 2018 through June 2018

On January 18, 2018, National Grid proposed a Residential SOS rate of \$0.08038/kWh for the period April 2018 through September 2018.<sup>5</sup> This represents a decrease of \$0.01477/kWh,<sup>6</sup> or 16%, from the current Residential SOS rate of \$0.09515/kWh.<sup>7</sup> Compared to last year's April 2017 to September 2017 SOS Residential rate of \$0.06228/kWh, the proposed rate of \$0.08038/kWh is 29% higher than the same six-month period in the previous year.<sup>8</sup>

The Company proposed a fixed Commercial SOS rate of \$0.07926/kWh for the same period.<sup>9</sup> This proposed rate is a decrease of \$0.01424/kWh,<sup>10</sup> or 15%, from the current fixed Commercial SOS rate of \$0.09350/kWh.<sup>11</sup> The Company proposed the following variable Commercial SOS rates:<sup>12</sup>

The three-month average of the proposed Industrial rates for the period April 2018 through June 2018 is \$0.06335/kWh. This represents a 33% decrease from the three-month average rate of \$0.09431/kWh for the period January 2018 through March 2018.<sup>14</sup>

## III. Decision

On March 1, 2018, the Division of Public Utilities and Carriers (Division) filed a revised memorandum summarizing the filing and concluding that the calculations for National Grid's proposed SOS rates are correct and the filing is in compliance with the PUC approved Standard Offer Service Procurement Plan.<sup>15</sup> On March 2, 2018, based on the recommendation of the Division, the PUC voted unanimously to approve the Company's proposed SOS rates for the Residential Group and Commercial Group for the period April 2018 through September 2018 and the Industrial Group for the period April 2018 through June 2018.

Accordingly, it is hereby
