By adopting a new PIPP, you can make a difference for the poorest families in the state. Please give serious consideration to doing so.





In my state over 20,000 people have their electricity shut off every year, as a concerned resident of Rhode Island I would like to encourage you to support the PIPP which will dramatically decrease the numbers of utility shut offs.


