Request:

Have any other carport projects enrolled in the Renewable Energy Growth Program? If so, please provide the size, class, price, and tariff term for each.

Response:

The TGD Solar Carport project applied as a Solar PV – Ground Mount medium-scale solar project in the 2017 Third Open Enrollment. The Company searched the Renewable Energy Growth Program application database for all historical applications submitted for projects greater than 25 kilowatts, and this is the only project that used the word “carport” in their application submittal. If any other system approved by the Program was installed as a carport, it is not known to National Grid.

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Post-Decisional PUC 1-2

Request:

There is a 250kW carport net metering system at 681 Kingstown Road in South Kingstown, Rhode Island. Please provide information regarding the interconnection of this facility, including the date and current renewable net metering credit being paid for the project.

Response:

The 250kW carport net metering system located at 681 Kingstown Road in South Kingstown, Rhode Island was authorized to interconnect on September 4, 2018. The Company received the application for this net metering system on July 6, 2016. This is a behind the meter system, and the Company has not seen any net excess generation. Therefore, this system did not produce any net metering credits. The customer at this location is served by Rate G-02, and, currently, the per kWh rate that would be credited for any excess net metering generation is \$0.13129.
