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Highlights of the 2020 DSM Program

Residential Conservation Programs:

Home Energy Audits with Weatherization Incentives - A total of 28 home energy audits were performed by Energy New England from January-December. There have been 397 LED lightbulbs and 34 Smart strips that were directly installed into homes that completed an energy audit. \$35,147 was paid for this program to date, funded by Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (2018-B). In addition, two commercial and industrial energy audits have been performed by RISE at no cost. Eleven residential weatherization projects were also completed.

Residential Energy Star Offerings – The District processed 120 appliance rebates comprised of 9 refrigerators, 17 refrigerator buybacks, 22 clothes washers, 19 clothes dryers, 21 room air conditioners, 7 printers, 9 dehumidifiers, 5 televisions, 9 computers and 1 each of air purifiers and computer monitors. The District issued a total of \$7,417 in rebates.

HVAC & Water Heating Program- 12 customers took advantage of the HVAC & Water Heating program in 2020 and the District issued \$3,100 in rebates.

Change a Light Program – The District purchased 100 lighting kits from Project Energy Savers to distribute to customers. The kits contain 2 LED lightbulbs, 1 LED nightlight and an energy guide to lighting.

Committed for 2019 Programs- The District processed 17 incentives from 2019 that qualified for rebates totaling \$2,342.00. The rebates were for 34 windows, 5 refrigerator buybacks, 3 airsource heat pumps, 2 oil boilers, and one each of ventilation fans, printers, ceiling lights and doors.

Industrial/ Commercial Programs:

Small Business Energy Star Offerings: The District processed one rebate for a refrigerator buyback and new purchase of a refrigerator in the amount of \$144.00.

Burrillville School Department: The District has worked with the School Department on several energy efficiency projects over the years. Burrillville High School could not move forward with the LED lighting project scheduled for 2020, due to budgetary issues. We will continue to work with them to try to find a path forward.

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Highlights of the 2020 DSM Program

Committed Funds-Lighting & EE Projects- Ashton Court built on the success of its exterior lighting project from 2019 and completed a LED interior lighting project in all of its elderly affordable housing units in 2020. The project cost \$58,171 with Pascoag providing a rebate of \$23,017. This project will provide 58,133 kWh savings annually.

Potential 2020 Lighting & EE Projects-The District completed a small lighting project at St. Joseph's church for lighting in their hallways, kitchen and restrooms. The project cost \$7,227 and the District provided a rebate of \$2,848. The project will save them 3,424 kWh annually and reduce their kW by 3.42.

LED Street Light Incentive- The DSM Program rebated Pascoag Utility District \$10,000 for the LED Street Light Project that was completed in 2016 in which the District purchased and installed 610 LED Street Lights. This money reduces the Account Receivable from the DSM Program from \$83,096 to \$73,096.

Administrative:

Administrative- The District spent \$21,008 on administrative labor, supplies and mileage associated with the various DSM projects.

Energy Consultant-The District spent \$10,000 on consultation services provided by Optimal Energy. Pascoag and Optimal Energy met virtually throughout the year to discuss COVID-19 impacts on the DSM program and planning for 2021.

Program Research and Development- There was no activity to report.

Community Outreach, Marketing & Education

Funds for Follow-up to Successful Programs- The District has processed 7 rebates for 2 clothes washers, 1 dryer, 1 television, 1 computer, 1 LED light, 1 gas boiler and 1 air source heat pump from 2019 due to funds being depleted from the Committed for 2019 program. The total amount issued in rebates was \$832.00.

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Highlights of the 2020 DSM Program

Outreach/Education-The District has spent \$7,521.00 on conservation promotional items, advertisements and billing inserts to promote the energy efficiency programs we offer.

Jesse Smith Library Partnership- the Jesse Smith Memorial Library in conjunction with the Public Works Department and the Pascoag Utility District encourages students in grades K-6 to create Earth Day Posters depicting why it is important to recycle and conserve energy in Burrillville. A total of twelve winning posters were chosen to be included in a 2021 calendar which also contained energy conservation and recycling tips. The contest was conducted partially by virtual means, due to the closure of schools in March. Parents submitted entries by email to the District. The calendars were ordered and distributed in the fall of 2020. The District has spent a total of \$2,746.00 on this project.

Community Events- The District's community event participation was drastically limited due to the pandemic. Prior to March, staff members were able to visit Burrillville High school to speak to an 11th grade math class about electric bills and the effects of conserving electricity on it. The District also had the opportunity to host a field trip for Steere Farm Elementary School's fourth grade. The children got a tour of the facility, learned about the role of the electric company in their community and worked on energy conservation posters while they were here. The District has spent \$235.00 on materials for Community Events.

Energy Efficiency Management Continuing Education- Staff attended several virtual meetings/conferences but have not participated in any offsite meetings at this time. \$568 was spent on energy efficiency and demand-side management professional development memberships.

Pascoag's 2020 DSM Program had significant challenges due to the pandemic. In March 2020, all inperson home energy audits were suspended due to stay at home orders. In mid-April, Energy New England began offering "Remote" Home Energy Audits to customers. Despite increased advertising on social media, our website, and local media customer uptake was slow. In July, we petitioned the Public Utilities Commission to increase the weatherization and air sealing rebate percentage from 75% to 100% as well as raise the maximum rebate caps from \$800 for insulation and \$500 for air sealing to a combined total of \$3,000 per customer. Pascoag's request was approved in late September and we were able to move forward with a few weatherization projects before the end of the year. The total budget for 2020 was \$197,901.86; with \$107,481.62 collected from customer billing, \$83,700 from RGGI Funds and carry over funds from 2019 of \$6,720.24. The total expenses to date for 2020 were \$127,925.07.
