NOTICE OF TECHNICAL RECORD SESSION

Pursuant to Rhode Island Gen. Laws § 39-3-11, the Public Utilities Commission (PUC) will conduct a hearing on **Thursday, October 15, 2020 @ 10:00 A.M.** in Hearing Room A at the PUC's office located at 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island. The hearing will be streamed live at http://www.ustream.tv/channel/WqQyXw296dg.

R.I. Gen. Laws 39-3-1.2 enables municipal aggregation which allows a city or town to aggregate its electric load and procure electric supply from a nonregulated power producer for its residents and businesses. In 2017, the General Assembly made it easier for municipalities to enroll residents in an aggregation program by removing a special election requirement for automatic enrollment. Several municipalities have expressed interest in municipal aggregation and filed with the Commission, for approval of an aggregation plan. On August 11, 2020, National Grid filed an application to add Terms and Conditions for Municipal Aggregators. The proposed Terms and Conditions will apply to Municipal Aggregators conducting business pursuant to a municipal aggregation plan. National Grid proposes to establish uniform terms and conditions for customers, the Company, municipal aggregators, and nonregulated power producers in connection with aggregation of electric supply. At this technical session, the Commission will hear explanation from National Grid regarding the details and specifics of its proposed Terms and Conditions. Commission will also hear from intervenors who submitted comments and proposed amendments to National Grid's Terms and Conditions for Municipal Aggregators.

To the extent that there is overlap with National Grid's proposed Terms & Conditions for Nonregulated Power Producers, currently pending before the PUC in Docket No. 5059, reference may be made to that proposed tariff.

National Grid's proposal is available for examination at the PUC's office. Reference is also made to Chapters 42-35 and 39-1 of the Rhode Island General Laws.
