In reviewing the questions below it appears Verizon made an error in the original request. Verizon mistakenly requested 1 block when the need was for two blocks (blocks 5&6).

Verizon responses are in red:

1. Verizon has requested 1500 consecutive numbers but requested one 1,000 block with a requested 401-586-5XXX or 401-586-6XXX. Please confirm that Verizon is seeking an order to allow the release of one 1,000 block only, beginning with 5 or 6 in the 401-586 NPA-NXX. Do you know if these numbers are available and is one more preferable than the other? **The Number of Thousands-Blocks Requested should have been 2 not 1**
2. Will Verizon use the other 525 available numbers listed on the MTE worksheet (appendix 2) to meet the remaining need of the Navy? Please explain. **No, we need two consecutive blocks per the customer's request. They realize they will not receive them in the same NPA NXX they currently have, but do require that they are contiguous.**
3. Will the utilization rate of 64.95% be affected by the fact that Verizon is seeking a 1,000 number block to serve 1500 numbers? Please explain. **No it will not since the request should have been for two new blocks not one.**
4. Are the requested numbers to be put into service in addition to the numbers already assigned to the Navy/Naval War College? If not, why can't Verizon use the existing numbers?

Verizon re-submitted the request to NANPA. Attached are the revised Part 1a, MTE, and Part 3 denials.

Per the customer: They are asking for new TN's that have the same NPA NXX, and that they be contiguous.
