Dear Ms. Massaro:

Enclosed please find five (5) copies of provisional responses from The Narragansett Electric Company, d/b/a National Grid ("National Grid" or the "Company"), to data requests 1-5, 1-6, and 1-8 through 1-15 issued by the Attorney General on May 12, 2006, as well as supplemental responses to data requests 1-3 and 1-4.

With regard to the above-mentioned data requests, National Grid has numerous objections relating to scope and relevancy, as well as concerns about confidentiality. However, the Company has agreed to a process with the Attorney General for review of documents. It is our understanding that the Attorney General agrees that this process is sufficient for tolling the Division's procedural requirements for the filing of responses and objections within five business days of receipt of the data requests.

If the Attorney General becomes dissatisfied with the arrangements made, the Attorney General can file a motion to compel with the Hearing Officer at any time, to which the Company would respond. In any event, it is the Company's hope that the document review process will satisfy the Attorney General and there will be no need of requesting any intervention by the Hearing Officer on this discovery matter.

Attorney General Data Request 1-5

Request:

Provide all documents provided to the Board(s) of Directors of National Grid that discuss, reflect or relate to the purchase of Southern Union Rhode Island assets by National Grid.

Response:

Attorney General Data Request 1-6

Request:

Provide all minutes of the Board(s) of Directors of National Grid that discuss, reflect or relate to the purchase of Southern Union's Rhode Island assets by National Grid.

Attorney General Data Request 1-8

Request:

Provide all documents that discuss, reflect or relate to consolidated anticipated cost savings (or estimates thereof) for the following items:

- a) consolidation of National Grid and Southern Union accounting and CIS systems;
- b) retraining National Grid customer service representatives to address natural gas customer service, termination and billing issues; and
- c) conversion of a mainframe and Itron Meter Reading System to effect single reading of gas and electric meters.

Response:

In response to this data request, the Company has made arrangements with the Attorney General to establish a data room for the Attorney General to review certain documents related to the transaction. In addition, the Company states the following in response to the request:

- a) The Company will consolidate National Grid and New England Gas Company ("NEGAS") accounting functions upon the integration of Narragansett and NEGAS. However, the Company does not at this time intend to use any accounting "system" hardware of the current NEGAS. In addition, there are no plans to consolidate the NEGAS customer service and billing functions with National Grid's New England CIS system. The Company is in the process of developing a new CSS system that ultimately would be used for all National Grid electric and gas distribution companies, including Rhode Island. See the Company's response to Division Data Request 2-1.
- b) The integration team is currently in the process of developing training plans.
- c) The Company is currently evaluating the functionality of the existing NEGAS and National Grid Automated Meter Reading systems. See the Company's response to Division Data Request 2-5.

Attorney General Data Request 1-9

Request:

Provide all documents that reflect or relate to National Grid's estimate that "potential gross savings in the gas business in Rhode Island" will be within the "range of \$1 million to \$3 million annually (pretax)."

While the company does not rule out involuntary reductions if needed . . . and would endeavor to do so again. Provide all documents that reflect or relate to National Grid's plan to make reductions: (a) by way of voluntary termination programs, and (b) by way of involuntary reductions.

The Company has not yet developed the details of any voluntary termination programs or established any process for involuntary reductions, if any.

Attorney General Data Request 1-13

Request:

Provide all documents relating to any and all National Grid plans to consolidate billing, customer service or other functions of Southern Union with a National Grid facility located in Westborough, Massachusetts, and with respect to such plan identify the number and nature of all jobs that would be transferred from Rhode Island to Massachusetts.

In response to this data request, the Company has made arrangements with the Attorney General to establish a data room for the Attorney General to review certain documents related to the transaction. In addition, the Company states the following in response to the request:

The Company has no plans to consolidate billing or customer service functions with a National Grid facility located in Westborough, Massachusetts. However, the consolidation of some functions may occur within National Grid facilities in other locations. With respect to other functions, such as finance, rates, or accounting, plans have not been finalized.

Attorney General Data Request 1-14

Request:

Provide all documents that reflect or relate to any and all National Grid plans to, after the asset purchase has closed, outsource the Dig Safe marking function that is currently undertaken by Southern Union employees.

Upon the integration of Narragansett and New England Gas Company, the Dig Safe marking function will continue, initially, to be performed by gas company employees. The Company will evaluate all areas of operations to determine the most efficient allocation of resources at a later date.
