## **NOTICE OF FINAL HEARINGS (continued)**

Pursuant to the provisions of R.I. Gen. Laws §§ 42-98 and 42-35, and Rule 1.12 of its Rules of Practice and Procedure (Rules), the Energy Facility Siting Board (Board) will continue its final hearings in the above-captioned matter on **Friday, May 13, 2022 beginning at 9:30 AM in Hearing Room A of the Public Utilities Commission office building, 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick, Rhode Island.** This is a continuation of hearings that were commenced on October 12, 2021. Pursuant to Rules 1.8(a) and 1.18(c), the hearings may continue from day to day, time to time, and place to place, as required.

In an application filed with the Board on December 30, 2020, Revolution Wind, LLC (the Applicant) seeks the approval of the Board to site and construct the transmission and interconnection infrastructure necessary to deliver energy onshore from the Revolution Wind Project, a 704 MW offshore wind farm located in federal waters. The application seeks Board approval for six transmission and interconnection components located within the state of Rhode Island, including: an onshore transmission cable, a 23-mile submarine export cable running from federal waters to the onshore transmission cable, and an onshore substation located proximate to the existing Davisville substation in Quonset. Note that the applicant is not seeking Board approval for the construction of the offshore wind turbines or offshore substation associated with the Revolution Wind Project, as they are located in federal waters and thus outside of the Board's jurisdiction. The application is on file and available for public review at the Board office located within the Public Utilities Commission office building at 89 Jefferson Boulevard, Warwick. At the May 13 hearing, the Board will hear evidence regarding the alternative on-shore cable route proposed by the Applicant in response to the Board's Record Request 15, which the Applicant claims will avoid cable burial along Camp Avenue and thus avoid impacts to Camp Avenue residents.
